Sounds We Make Cheat Sheet

achoo (or atchoo) - the sound of sneezing

aah (*or* **ahhhhhhhhh) –** a sound that expresses relief or relaxation

ahh—exclamation of surprise or fright; a variant of *aah* used as a sound of pleasure, relief, or relaxation

aha – the sound we make when we discover something (Example: Aha, there are my keys!)

ahem – to represent a sound that you make to get someone's attention_in a polite and quiet way. **Also** used in writing to represent a sound that you make before you say something that may be slightly surprising or shocking

argh - a sound used to express upset or pain

argh – exclamation of frustration, comparable to *rats* or *drat*; sometimes used for a pirate's exclamation

arrr – pirate's sound of agreement; pirate's exclamation

aw, ohh, ahh – "That's too bad" "Aww, it hit him right in the nuts!" Feeling sorry or pity for someone.

aww – exclamation over the cuteness of something

bah, **beh** – this is used to express contempt, disdain or severe upset

blah – (typically written three times) to show that either someone droned on about a topic or what had been said was predictable and/or commonplace and all parties now listening understand what was said without it being necessary to repeat what was said "And then she moaned about her husband. You know, blah blah blah."

blech – mild to medium exclamation of disgust

boo – a sound made when startling someone or trying to surprise them

boo-hoo – a word used in comic books or children's stories to show that someone is crying

burr – the sound a person makes to indicate he or she is cold chomp – the sound of taking a bite

crunch – the sound made when eating crunchy food like crackers or chips; also the sound of footsteps on hard stones like gravel

d'oh – a sound made when someone suddenly realizes they have made a foolish mistake; Homer Simpson is famous for making this sound

duh – exclamation of exasperation or disdain over the explanation of something obvious

eek – the sound a person makes when he or she is scared; this sound is often made when someone is scared by something small like a mouse, not when being scared by something big like a bear

eh – mild exclamation of unconcern or indifference (*Eh*, who cares.); solicitation to repeat something (*Eh*, what was that?); question tag (*You heard about it*, *eh*?)

er – placeholder signifying hesitation, confusion, ignorance, or even guilt, often indicating that the speaker is thinking frantically; may be followed by an ellipsis (*Er . . . I'm not sure.*); variations are *ah*, *um*, and *uh*

ew – exclamation of disgust, typically over something nasty; can be made more dramatic by repeating letters (*Ewww, that's foul. Eeew, that stinks.*)

glug – the sound of swallowing a lot of liquid quickly

ha-ha – the sound of laughter

humpf, **humph** – an expression of stubbornness, doubt, or contempt

hm, hmm – used for the sound you make when you're pausing to think before saying something OR a sound you make when you want someone to say or repeat something

hooah – U.S. Army sound of agreement or affirmation; battle cry; [pronounced *hua*, accent on *hoo*]

hooyah – U.S. Navy sound of agreement or affirmation; battle cry

ho ho – a sound that someone makes when they laugh or are pretending to laugh

hooray (or hurrah) – an exclamation of joy

huh – a sound that expresses confusion; this sound is usually made to invite someone to respond or provide more information

ick – exclamation of disgust; see: yuck

ooh – an expression of amazement, wonder, or understanding

meh – old-fashioned mild interjection of dismissal or indifference, much like beh

mm-hmm - murmur of agreement that may also indicate inattention; much like uh-huh

mm – a spoken sound when someone else is speaking and you want to show that you are listening or that you agree with them.

mmm - murmur of pleasure

mwah – Simulating you're giving someone a kiss with lip movement

mwahaha – mock-sinister laugh, often used for a villain; also **mwah-ha-ha**; variant is **bwahaha**

nah – informal no; opposite of *yeah*; [pronounced two ways: like the n-a in *nap* or the n-o in *not* rather than as *nay*]

nuh-uh – childish argumentative no; opposite of yuh-huh; [stress on *uh*]

oomph – sound of exhalation of breath, often after a collision (may be comic)

oorah – U.S. Marine sound of agreement or affirmation; battle cry

ow – exclamation of pain

pfft – old-fashioned sound of dismissal or unconcern (not common in contemporary fiction); also phfft

phew – exclamation of relief, often used humorously in contemporary fiction OR a sound related to fatigue or being tired

phooey – mild interjection used to show disagreement or disbelief; also a mild curse word akin to *darn* or *drat*, but more genteel

psst – usually) quiet interjection used to gain the attention of someone else

sheesh – exclamation of exasperation; a mild oath used in place of Jesus; also geez

shh, **shhh** – used for telling someone to stop talking or to be less noisy

shoo – a sound made when trying to drive something (usually an animal) away (Exmpale: Shoo, shoo, get out of here.)

sniff - the sound of smelling

ta-da, ta-dah – a sound that means 'here it is' or 'all done look at this'; this sound is usually made after completing something

tut – used for showing you are annoyed or do not approve of something This word represents the sound you make by putting your tongue in the position for a "T" and sucking air in.

tee hee – used for expressing the sound of a short laugh

ugh – used for the sound that people make when they think something is extremely unpleasant

uggh - an exclamation of frustration and annoyance

uh-huh – a sound that is used to indicate agreement or when people agree with something, or when they say "yes" to a question

uh – placeholder signifying hesitation, confusion, ignorance, or even guilt, often indicating that the speaker is thinking frantically; may be followed by an ellipsis (*Uh, I think it's that one. Uh . . . I'm not sure that what you're saying is true.*); variations are **ah, er,** and **um**

uh, uh – command, often to young children, to stop doing something (*Uh, uh, uh, don't touch that.*)

uh-oh – an expression of concern or dismay that something unexpected just happened or something went wrong

um – used for the sound that people make when they are <u>thinking</u> about what to say next or when they are not sure how someone will react to what they are going to say

wahoo – an exclamation of joy and enthusiasm

whoa – exclamation of surprise or shock (not woah)

yay – exclamation of triumph or victory (*Yay*, we won!)

yea – yes; used in the context of a spoken vote; rhymes with and is often paired with *nay*

yeah – contemporary informal yes; opposite of *nah* (*Yeah*, *I get it*.); [does not rhyme with *nay*]

yech – variation of yuck, an exclamation of disgust

yeow – exclamation of pain, shock, or surprise; also **yow**

yikes – exclamation of (negative) surprise or shock; comic

yow – variation of yeow, an exclamation of pain, shock, or surprise

yowza – exclamation of pleasure or pleased surprise or a pleasant

yippee – a sound made to indicate delight (Example: Yippee, I just learned a lot of new English words!)

vroom – used to represent the loud sound vehicles make when moving fast

wham – used to represent the loud sound of something being hit hard

whee – used to represent the sound children make when they are enjoying moving fast, like a swing or slide

whew – a sound you make when you're uncomfortable or surprised, or when you feel happy that something has finished. This sound is sometimes written as Phew.

whoomph – used for the sound that something makes when it travels very quickly or hits something else with a lot of force

yecch – used for the sound "yuck"

yuck, yuk – used for saying that you think someone, or something is dirty, ugly or unpleasant

yuh-huh – argumentative or insistent childish yes; [accent on huh]; opposite of nuh-uh

zzz – a way of writing the sound that someone makes when they are sleeping, often used in cartoons
